Respondents.	SUSPENSION OF LICENSES PURSUANT TO NRS 233B.127(3)

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The State of Nevada, Department of Business and Industry, Division of Insurance 9 ("Division") is informed and believes that licensees Mary Margaret Flud, Resident Producer 10 License No. 20852 ("Flud"), and Flud Insurance and Business Management, Resident Producer 11 Firm License No. 17829 ("Flud Insurance"), sometimes referred to collectively herein as "Flud," 12 have committed serious violations of the Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS") and Nevada 13 Administrative Code ("NAC") regulating the business of insurance, as well as civil and criminal 14 statutes. Flud's Resident Producer License No. 20852 technically expired on April 1, 2019, 15 although it is still classified as active pending the expiration of a 30-day period during which 16 licensees may renew their license by paying a certain late fee. Flud Insurance's Resident 17 Producer Firm License No. 17829 expires on May 1, 2019, if not renewed. 18

On December 10, 2018, the Division received a consumer complaint from a long-time Flud client (the "Client"). The Client discovered that while it had paid premiums to Flud for seven years, the premiums were not remitted by Flud to the insurer, First Financial Insurance Company ("First Financial"), leaving the Client uninsured.

Soon after receiving the complaint from the Client, the Division received an anonymous
email sent from Flud's email account claiming that Mary Flud had been planning to close her
insurance business at the beginning of 2019, REDACTED BY DOI , and the
business records were being destroyed. *See*, Anonymous Email, attached hereto as Exhibit A.
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To prevent the further destruction of records, the Division issued a Cease and Desist Order to Flud on January 24, 2019, ordering the preservation of insurance records and asking for additional information regarding the matter. *See*, Cease and Desist Order, attached hereto as Exhibit B.

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Division investigators discovered bank account numbers for some of Flud's accounts at Wells Fargo Bank. On March 15, 2019, the Division issued a Subpoena Duces Tecum to Wells Fargo requesting all of Flud's bank records in Wells Fargo's possession dating back to 2012.

A review of Flud's bank records reveals a serious trend: There are very few transfers of funds, by any means, to insurers. According to the review performed by Division Investigator John Parnell, \$1.33 million in insurance premiums were desposited into Flud's account, but only \$250,000 was shown as remitted to insurers; a shortfall of \$1,080,000. Additionally, the bank records show a large number of withdrawals from the Wells Fargo account, both in number and amount, done at casinos in Las Vegas; approximately \$600,000 in casino ATM withdrawals over the seven-year period. *See*, Affidavit of John Parnell, attached hereto as Exhibit C.

The Cease and Desist Order issued on January 24, 2019, ordered Flud to provide the Division with the location of all of its business records and bank account numbers. As of the date of this Order for Summary Suspension, Flud has failed to contact the Division. Moreover, the Division sent a return email after receiving the above-referenced anonymous email, but Flud, nor anyone else on her behalf, has responded.

According to the Division's records, Flud does not appear to employ any other people; neither licensed producers nor unlicensed employees, who can respond to the Division or manage Flud's business.

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FINDING AND ORDER

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NRS 233B.127(3) states, in pertinent part, as follows:

If an agency finds that public health, safety or welfare imperatively require emergency action, and incorporates a finding to that effect in its order, summary suspension of a license may be ordered pending proceedings for revocation or other action . . . Proceedings relating to the order of summary suspension must be instituted and determined within 45 days after the date of the order unless the agency and the licensee mutually agree in writing to a longer period.

1	Based on the foregoing, it is hereby found that sufficient evidence exists to form a
2	reasonable belief as to the truth of the alleged offenses such that allowing Mary Flud to continue
3	to conduct business in the capacity of a Resident Producer, and Flud Insurance and Business
4	Management to do business in the capacity of a Resident Producer Firm would endanger public
5	safety and welfare. Therefore, emergency action to immediately suspend the licenses of Mary
6	Flud and Flud Insurance and Business Management pursuant to NRS 233B.127(3) is warranted.
7	NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:
8	1. The Resident Producer License of Mary Flud, License No. 20852, is immediately
9	suspended pursuant to NRS 233B.127(3).
10	2. The Resident Producer Firm License of Flud Insurance and Business Management,
11	License No. 17829, is immediately suspended pursuant to NRS 233B.127(3).
12	3. A hearing relating to this Order of Summary Suspension must be instituted and
13	determined within 45 days after the date of this Order unless the Division and Flud
14	mutually agree in writing to a longer period. The hearing will be conducted in
15	accordance with NRS Chapter 233B, NRS 679B, and NAC 679B.
